

Welcome Back

We hope you all had a lovely half-term break. A big **HELLO!** to the new families we have starting with us this week.

We have a couple of big events coming up, the first being World Book Day and the events we put in to support it. Reading / storytelling is a vital part of our ethos and curriculum and each day our children are read to, either at group time or individually, for those children that request it. We and the children have favourite stories that they know and love. Recently we have noticed some of them wanting to take on our role and 'read' to a group. This is fantastic to see and we support this by encouraging them to look at the pictures and say what they see if they cannot remember all the repeated refrains of the story.



Over the past month or so we have recorded some of these lovely moments and will be feeding them out gradually on Facebook / Instagram, in the run up to World Book Day. Please 'like' or 'love' these posts so we can see who has viewed.

In addition to this, we also have a few of the more able residents from local care home, Darlington Court, coming in as they did last year, to read some familiar stories to our older children. This was a big success with both parties last year.

Also, we have liaised with St Margaret's School and invited groups of year 6 children to come over at different points of the week of World Book Day, to read in small groups with the children.

We have noticed that although all of our children in their last year have been given a home / school bookbag, there are some children that rarely, if ever, bring them in. Please use us as a resource for books and reading. Time spent in reading / sharing a story is so valuable to their

development and research has shown time and time again the benefit this brings to pre-school children.

Finally, the children love a story, especially from a familiar adult. We would love it if any of you could bring in a favourite story and read it to the children. It should be short as their attention is limited, with pictures you can show them, around 5 minutes is usually enough. Props are welcome and the staff will not be looking at you and judging your reading! The older children can have a slightly longer story (around 10 minutes). We will have a slip at the end of this letter which you can fill in and return if you would like to do this.



Fundraising Events

We have a couple of fundraising events this half-term.

On Friday 15th March it's Comic Relief - 'Do Something Funny for Money'. We are asking families that would like to participate to dress up, as comically as you like. Children in their last year with us can also bring an envelope with a joke in, which they can tell to the group (let them practice this at home a few times). We will record some of them to show you on Facebook / Insta. We would ask for $\pounds 1$ minimum, voluntary donation from families today, if they can please.

We are also supporting one of our current children by participating in 'Rock your Socks' for World Down's Syndrome Day on Thursday 21st March. The idea from Rock your Socks is because Chromosome 21, which Down's Syndrome children are born with, looks like little socks.

Today, please send your child in wearing their brightest, most funny socks—preferably on show! Again, voluntary contributions of at least £1 would be much appreciated.
